The Importance of Stormwater Management

The Center for Watershed Protection stated the water quality impacts from urban runoff are significant, and that streams, lakes and estuaries are contaminated due to this runoff. Water runoff is excess water that penetrates and travels over land, which



ultimately finds its way to a common point. The common point where Fairview's water runoff travels is Lake Lavon, which also supplies the town with its drinking water. The majority of our runoff is produced by rain, melting snow/ice, and residential/commercial water sprinklers. Fairview's Town Engineer James Chancellor made the following points:
