


At the November 3, 2015 regular Town Council meeting, the Town Council addressed the following items:

- Received a presentation from Ray Edwards regarding utility billing issues related to high water volumes. No action was taken.
- Approved the minutes from the October 6, 2015 regular Town Council meeting.
- Approved an ordinance approving the 2015-16 fiscal year tax roll and providing an effective date.
- Approved rejecting all merchant credit card services RFPs.
- Mayor Darion Culbertson presented an Arbor Day Proclamation to observe Fairview's commitment to preserving its trees and natural beauty.
- Approved a request made by Greystar GP II, LLC for the approval of an amendment to the Framework Plan of the Commercial Planned Development District (CPDD) within the Urban Village Sub-District in Overlay B to add the Mixed Residential building types contained in Overlay A and consider approval of Major Warrants in association with a development plan for an age restricted independent residential living facility on property being 5.748± acres of land more specifically described as Lot 2R-1, Block A, North Addition situated in the J. Dixon Survey, Abstract No. 276 and generally located at the northeast corner of Convention Drive and Murray Farm Road. (MW2015-02).
- Approved a Final Plat for the Wooded Creek Villas Addition, a proposed residential neighborhood comprised of 10 singlefamily residential lots, 58 town house lots and 6 lots of common

- open space on a 14.160± acre tract of land situated in the John A. Taylor Survey Abstract No. 909, Tract 24 & 45, and that is generally located at the southeast corner of Bluebird Lane and State Highway 5. (FP2015-06).
- Approved a request by Kittyhawk LLC for approval of the Landscaping Plan associated with the approved Concept Plan Amendment for a proposed single family attached (townhome) residential development on a 6.5± acre tract of land that is situated in the John A. Taylor Survey, Abstract No. 909, zoned Commercial Planned Development District (CPDD), Neighborhood General Sub-District, and is generally located west of the intersection of SH 5 and Meandering Way. (CPA2015-01).
- Approved entering into a professional service agreement with Claymoore Engineering for the design of a pedestrian bridge connecting Chamberlain Place with the Sloan Creek Subdivision.
- Approved an ordinance amending the building regulations of the town and take any necessary action.
- Received monthly financial report for the period ending September 30, 2015.
- Received quarterly investment report for the period ending September 30, 2015.
- Received an update regarding the county radio system.
- Received an update on the Stacy Road construction project.
- Received an update on the creation of a Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District.

STACY ROAD UPDATE

The Stacy Road widening project saw several delays throughout fall due to utility relocations that took longer than expected. TxDOT has asked the contractor, Ed Bell Construction, to start on the North side of the road from State Highway 5 to Meandering Way/Angel Parkway. The clearing and roadbed preparation for the two new lanes on the North side is commencing. Underground storm drains are being extended in preparation for the first two of the future four, concrete lanes. Furthermore, the median will be wide enough that it could accommodate two additional lanes in the future, should traffic congestion ever warrant them. The \$20 million Stacy Road project is being funded jointly by TxDOT, Collin County, State Highway 121 Regional Toll Revenue and the Town of Fairview. 




Fairview Alarm **Permit Renewals**

The Town of Fairview requires all alarm systems in any home or business in Fairview, whether monitored or not, to have a valid Alarm Permit. Alarm Permits must be renewed annually during the month of January.

The residential renewal fee is \$25 and the commercial renewal fee is \$50. The fee for a new residential permit is \$50 and a new commercial permit is \$100. Please be aware that there is a 3 percent fee on payments made by credit card. If you have an alarm system and do not currently have an Alarm Permit, please contact Officer Gandy at SGandy@FairviewTexas.org or 972-886-4211, ext. 5022.

For those who currently have an alarm permit, online renewal begins January 1. Alarm permits must be renewed by January 31. To renew your permit, simply visit FairviewTexasAlarm.com. On the site, you will need to enter your login name and password. If you are having trouble remembering your login name and/or password, please contact Officer Gandy; do not create a new account if you are having issues accessing your old account. 

Christmas Tree Fire Safety

Christmas is around the corner and you don't want a simple mistake to set your Christmas tree and home ablaze. Here are a few fire safety tips for both live and artificial Christmas trees from your Fairview Fire Department:

- Choose a live tree that looks fresh with green needles that do not fall off.
- Make sure artificial trees are flame retardant.
- Make sure your live tree stays hydrated and keep plenty of water in the base at all times.
- If a live tree develops brown and/or dropping needles, it is drying out and needs to be replaced.
- Always make sure Christmas lights are in safe, working condition. Keep an eye out for exposed or worn-out wires.
- Do not connect more than three strands of lights together.
- Keep your tree at least three feet away from exposed flames and heat sources.
- Check manufacturers' labels for suggested lights and decorations that are flame retardant.
- Always turn off the lights on your tree when it is not supervised.
- Watch children and pets to avoid the chewing of wires and to prevent it from toppling over.

Fire Sprinkler Maintenance

It is critical that a fire sprinkler system be regularly maintained, contains an anti-freeze system, insulation is slightly less important, including ensuring that piping is fully and properly insulated. Sometimes insulation settles or is disturbed by someone moving or doing work in the attic. In some rare cases, an installer may have anti-freeze in the fire-sprinkler system. installed inadequate insulation, as the Town found in one home

In order to help prevent broken water pipes and the damage they can create, it is important that fire sprinkler systems be regularly inspected. A good rule of thumb is to walk your attic at least once per year. If you see any orange pipe, then the pipe is not properly insulated, possibly leading to a break during extreme weather. If you are unsure what to look for in an inspection, ask the installer of your sprinklers to inspect the system for you. If your house

All fire sprinkler systems have shut-off valves. It is important to know where your shut-off valve is located. This valve allows you to turn off the flow of water to your sprinkler system in case of a malfunction. Please locate your valve now and make sure it is readily accessible. If it is locked, be certain you can locate the key during an emergency. And, remember to make sure more than one person in your home knows the location and how to operate the shut-off valve. You never know who will be at home during an emergency.


