2015-2016 Fiscal Year Budget

Town Council and staff have been very busy working through the details of the Fiscal Year 2015-2016 budget. Two public hearings were scheduled for August 18 and August 25 to discuss the proposed budget and proposed property tax rate. The Proposed Budget can be found on our town website under Top News. We will post the Adopted Budget on our website under Top News and on the Administration Department page.

Budget Highlights:

- No planned property tax increases for the upcoming year
- Proposed property tax rate is \$0.359999 per \$100 valuation (same as last year's rate)
- Strong General Fund Reserve equal to 51% of the Town's General Fund expenses
- AA+ Debt Rating

- We continue to receive water and wastewater rate increases from the North Texas Municipal Water District, and thus for budgeting purposes, we've programmed a 15% increase in revenue. We will continue to work with a rate consultant to determine what the actual increase will be for the 2015-16 fiscal year.
- Budget includes improvements to the Town's website

Noah's



At the August Town Council meeting, the Town Council addressed the following items:

- Approved minutes of the June 3, 2015 special council meeting.
- Approved minutes of the July 7, 2015 council meeting.
- Approved a resolution ratifying an appointment to the position of town secretary.
- Approved Amendment #11 of an Interlocal Agreement with Collin County regarding jail services.
- Approved an Amending Plat for Lot 9E, Block A, Village at Fairview Addition.
- Approved a request by Chamberlain Place, LP for approval of a Final Plat of Chamberlain Place Phase 1 and a Replat of Lot 2 and Lot 3, Jackson Estates and Lot 1, Block A, Ward Addition, in order to provide for a new residential neighborhood comprised of 45 single-family residential lots and 4 common area lots. The subject properties are generally located west of Stoddard Road and north of Sloan Creek. (FP2015-03).
- Approved a request by Chamberlain Place, LP to amend the Zoning Ordinance, specifically, Article 14.02, Division 11 (Conditional Use Permit District), Sec. 14.02.514 (Use Regulations), in order to add the One-Acre Ranch Estate (RE-1) zoning district as a permitted district for the conditional use of temporary concrete batching plants. (ZA2015-10).
- Approved a request by Chamberlain Place, LP for approval of a Conditional Use Permit in order to allow for the use of a temporary concrete batching plant to facilitate the installation of public infrastructure for Chamberlain Place Phase 1, a proposed residential subdivision that is zoned One-Acre Ranch Estate (RE-1) and is generally located west of Stoddard Road and north of Sloan Creek. (ZA2015-11).
- Approved a request by Grenadier Homes for Major Warrants pertaining to block configuration standards, building type standards and architectural standards for a 14.22± acre tract of land that is zoned Commercial Planned Development District (CPDD) Urban Transition Sub-district, and is generally located at the southeast corner of State Highway 5 and Bluebird Lane. (MW2015-01).
- Approved a resolution authorizing the Town of Fairview to enter into a Facilities Agreement with LandSmith Company, Inc., governing Town and Developer participation in the installation of public trail and sanitary sewer force main improvements for Chamberlain Place Phase 1.
- Approved a request by M. Christopher Custom Homes for approval of a Preliminary Plat for the Harper's Landing Addition, a proposed residential neighborhood comprised of 13 single-family residential lots on a 28.934± acre tract of land situated in the Robert Fitzhugh Survey Abstract No. 317 and that is generally located east of Farmstead Road and 1,600 north of Stacy Road. The subject property is zoned Two-Acre Ranch Estate (RE-2). (PP2015-03).
- Appointed and reappointed board members to the Public Art Committee, Technology Advisory Committee, Board of Adjustments, Economic and Community Development Corporations, Parks and Recreation Board, and Special Events Committee.
- Acted on a proposed tax rate for FY 2015-2016 and placement of a proposal to adopt the proposed tax rate on the agenda of a future meeting.
- Approved a resolution scheduling public hearings on the Town of Fairview proposed tax rate for August 18, 2015 and August 25, 2015.

Due to the tremendous outpouring of support shown last year, we will again have our Flags of Honor Garden. On October 10th from 10:00 am to noon, our ceremony which recognizes and honors present service members and past veterans with the planting of a flag or flags in their honor will be held. A flag or multiple flags can be reserved with a check, in any amount, made payable to WFSC. Names of all the honorees will be read out loud by dignitaries, an Honor Guard will present The Colors and Taps will be played. This is an event that honors our past and present warriors and you do not want to miss it!

Oncor is still in the process of installing the new power line to the north of the existing one along Stacy Road. TxDOT acquired additional right-of-way, and the existing power lines have to move.

Once this overhead power line is complete, Grande Communications, AT&T, CoServ and Time Warner will have to relocate their infrastructure. TxDOT is trying to get the section from SH5 to Angel Parkway started first, but they are having to wait until the utilities are moved. September should be the start of the road widening portion. Ed Bell Construction Company was awarded the project.


This project will widen Stacy Road from a two lane asphalt road to a four lane concrete road with wide sidewalks along both sides. There are some existing trees that will be removed within the new right-of-way or impacted by trimming.



Municipal Court

The Town of Fairview Municipal Court has jurisdiction over all fine-only offenses that have been committed in the Town of Fairview jurisdiction. These offenses include Class C misdemeanors, traffic offenses and town ordinance violations. The court collects fines, conducts trials by jury or judge and issues warrants of arrest.

We have three court dates a month. The second Monday of the month is for juveniles. The third Monday of the month is for initial appearance to enter a plea and show-cause hearings. The fourth Monday of the month is for pre-trials and trials.

The court has two employees: Kay Shields, Deputy Court Clerk, and Teresa Jordan, Court Administrator. Both employees possess a Level II certification from the State of Texas. They are required to do 12 hours of continuing education each year to maintain this certification and to keep up with new laws or changes. They download approximately 360 or more new citations a month and create files for these new cases. They keep track of driving safety course completions, deferred disposition files, payment plans and warrants. They also answer phone calls, take payments at the window and maintain the dockets.

Individuals receiving citations must respond by a specific date and time that is printed on the citation. They will need to enter a plea unless the citation is dismissible. A person has three plea options when charged with an act.

These include:

- No Contest (nolo contender) you do not contest or dispute the charges filed against you
- 2. Guilty you admit to the act for which you are charged
- 3. Not guilty you deny or have a good defense related to the charge

If an individual enters a plea of not guilty, they will be set for a trial either by judge or jury. This is their right under the United States Constitution. There are six jurors chosen from a group of at least 12. The Town has to start with 12 jurors before the court can proceed. The Town of Fairview sends out 60 summons for a jury trial.

Individuals may choose to do a defensive driving or a deferred adjudication in order to keep a citation from going on their driving record. They would need to contact the court for these options as there are certain stipulations in order to be approved for these options.

Drainage Project



One of our citizens notified the town about a widening erosion issue near a creek where some large pipes carry water underneath Hawkswood Drive (see photo above). This erosion, if unchecked, would continue moving to the west and more soil would end up in our creeks.



The Public Works Department was going to not only fill in this eroded channel, but it was also going to have to rebuild this steep creek bank that had washed away. Engineering and public works concluded that these blocks would make the perfect creek bank, and we would get to recycle some of our throw away material. With that being said, public works got busy and before long, they had carefully placed these concrete blocks and turned throw away materials into the picture above.



The town also had another problem: a large pile of concrete blocks of old road pavement that was an unsightly mess near our FM1378 water pumping station (see photo above).



Now that the blocks were set and filter fabric was laid behind it, soil and sodding was installed to re-establish the greenbelt that was there before the erosion (see photo above).

Thanks to the Public Works Department for a job well done and a concerned citizen who let us know about the growing problem.





National Pharmaceutical Take Back Initiative

On September 26th, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will coordinate a collaborative effort with state and local law enforcement agencies focused on removing potentially dangerous controlled substances from our nation's medicine cabinets. A national take-back day will provide a unified opportunity for the public to surrender expired, unwanted or unused pharmaceutical controlled substances and other medications to law enforcement officers for destruction. This one-day effort will bring national focus to the issue of pharmaceutical controlled substance abuse. The program provides an opportunity for law enforcement to collaborate with the DEA and establish a safe collection site.

This program is anonymous and all efforts will be made to protect the anonymity of individuals disposing of medications. Controlled, non-controlled, and over-the-counter medications may be collected from individuals. The general public is often unaware of the distinction in medication status. Participants may dispose of medication in its original container or by removing the medication from its container and disposing of it directly into the disposal box. Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain sealed in the original container. The depositor should ensure the cap is tightly sealed to prevent leakage. Intravenous solutions, injectables and syringes will NOT be accepted due to potential hazard posed by blood-borne pathogens.

You have seen dinosaurs in the theaters, now come see them in a natural environment. From September 19, 2015 to February 21, 2016, visitors to Heard Natural Science Museum & Wildlife Sanctuary will be able to let their imagination run wild as they walk back in time along a half-mile nature trail with nine life-size animatronic dinosaurs during the ninth annual *Dinosaurs Live! Life-Size Animatronic Dinosaurs* exhibit. These animatronic dinosaurs move and roar, providing an experience sure to captivate visitors who will be able to also learn interesting facts about both herbivorous and carnivorous dinosaurs.

The exhibit features the infamous Tyrannosaurus Rex, a frequent favorite among past guests. Other dinosaur replicas on exhibit include a spitting Dilophosaurus, a Carnotaurus, a Torosaurus, an Acrocanthosaurus, an Edmontonia, a Stegosaurus, a Styracosaurus, and a Pachycephalosaurus.

Children will also have the opportunity to play on static Apatosaurus and Parasaurolophus baby dinosaurs and on a photo-op T-Rex. Preschool Nature Explorers

Do you remember how fascinating it was to explore your yard as a child? Or, maybe you have witnessed the joy that your children have experienced as a ladybug landed on their arms.

Now is the time to encourage your preschooler's love of nature! Beginning September 8th, preschool children will have the opportunity to come together and explore all that the Heard Natural Science Museum and Wildlife Sanctuary has to offer. In each class, your child will be engaged in hands-on learning experiences that promote an early connection to nature.

From forests to prairies to wetlands, preschoolers will explore the world around us. Using songs, finger plays and stories, they will discover how animals and plants make up a habitat and how they adapt to that habitat. 

Fire Safety Week

Fire Safety Week for the Town of Fairview is quickly approaching. The dates will be from October 4 to October 10. During this week, Fairview Fire Department will be traveling to various schools and businesses to talk about fire safety.

This year, the focus will be on smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. The theme for this year is "Hear the beep where you sleep".

Topics to be discussed include: maintenance, quarterly testing, detector placement, expired detectors, and steps to take when a smoke detector activates. The U.S. Fire Administration recommends that smoke detectors be replaced at the 10 year mark. This is to ensure that detectors are up to date and functioning properly. Batteries that have an extended life span are recommended for smoke detectors. Recommendation for changing smoke detector batteries is usually when the time change occurs. Carbon monoxide detectors are usually designed for a seven year life span. Batteries for carbon monoxide detectors are recommended to be changed more often due to the higher drain from the detector.


