COUNCIL'S CORNER

At the February 2, 2016 Regular Town Council meeting, the Town Council addressed the following items:

- Heard from Charley Murray regarding parking in the Villages of Fairview.
- Received a report from Public Art Committee Chairman, Karen Karnuta, regarding the upcoming Inaugural Town of Fairview Art Show.
- Received a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA).
- Approved the minutes of the January 5, 2016, Regular Town Council meeting.
- Approved an ordinance calling the May 7, 2016, General Election and authorizing the Town Manager to execute a joint agreement with Collin County for the provision of election services.
- Approved a resolution expressing official intent to reimburse costs of projects related to the acquisition of property for municipal purposes.
- Approved an ordinance authorizing a budget amendment pertaining to the fiscal year 2015-16 budget and providing an effective date.
- Approved a request by Steve Dinapoli, representing 84 Acres Red Oak Trail, LLC, for approval of a Final Plat for the Oak Meadows Addition, a proposed residential subdivision comprised of 10 single-family residential lots, 1 lot of common open space and 1 lot of parkland dedication on a 83.993± acre tract of land as recorded under Doc. # 2031226001676610, CCLR, situated in the George B. Pilant Survey – Abstract No. 691, Town of Fairview, Collin County, Texas, and that is generally located at the east end of Red Oak Trail north of Meandro Ria Lane. The subject property is zoned PC, Planned Center District. (FP2016-01).
- Approved a request by Greystar GP II, LLC, for approval of a Final Plat for the North Addition, Lots 3R-A & 2R-1A, Block A, being a replat of Lots 2R-1 & 3R, Block A, North Addition, recorded in Vol. 2008, Pg. 198, M.R.C.C.T. and Vol. 2013, Pg. 465, M.R.C.C.T. being 10.145 in the J. Dixon Survey - Abstract No. 276, Town of Fairview, Collin County, Texas, and generally located on the west side of Fairview Parkway and adjacent to the east side of Convention Drive. The subject property is zoned CPDD, Commercial Planned Development District. (FP2016-02).
- Approved a request by Jed Dolson, Kittyhawk LLC, for approval of a Final Plat for The Courts at Sloan Creek, being 36 residential lots and 8 open space lots on a 6.50 acre tract of land situated in the John A. Taylor Survey – Abstract No. 909, Town of Fairview, Collin County, Texas and that is generally located adjacent to and west of Highway 5 at the intersection of Meandering Way. (FP2016-03).
- Authorized the Town Manager to enter into a Facilities Agreement for the Courts at Sloan Creek.
- Approved a request by Larry C. and Jennifer L. Tooker for approval of a Final Plat for the Tooker Addition, a proposed residential subdivision comprised of 2 single-family residential lots on a 9.277 acre tract of land situated in the Samuel Sloan Survey – Abstract No. 791, Town of Fairview, Collin County, Texas, and that is generally located on the east side of Meandering Way north of Rushing Water CT. (FP2015-07).
- Discussed the Boards and Commissions and appointed a member to the Public Art Committee.
- Heard a staff overview of the Capital Improvements Plan document.
- Received the Monthly Financial Report for the period ending December 31, 2015.
- Received the Quarterly Investment Report for the period ending December 31, 2015.
- Received an update on the Stacy Road construction project.

STACY ROAD UPDATE

TxDOT has revised their target date to release the contractor, Ed Bell Construction, to perform the road reconstruction to March 1. Utility relocation progress meetings are currently being held monthly to see if they are on track to achieve this goal. Atmos Gas is currently the largest utility in the way of the road widening from State Highway 5 to Angel Parkway/Meandering Way. If Atmos can get the line installed by March 1 between State Highway 5 and Angel Parkway, the road contractor will be released to begin the actual road widening.



GREAT TEXAS WARRANT ROUNDUP

The Town of Fairview will participate in the annual Great Texas Warrant Roundup beginning Saturday, March 5 through Sunday, March 13, 2016. The roundup is designed to target thousands of defendants with traffic,

parking and municipal ordinance violations. It is believed to be the largest joint operation of its kind with arrests expected to continue for several days.

If you believe you may have a warrant, you are urged to contact the Town prior to this event to dispose of your cases voluntarily to avoid the inconvenience and embarrassment of an arrest at home or work, possibly in front of family, friends or coworkers.

The Town's municipal court is open to pay fines Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. For more information, visit fairviewtexas.org or please call 972-886-4240.

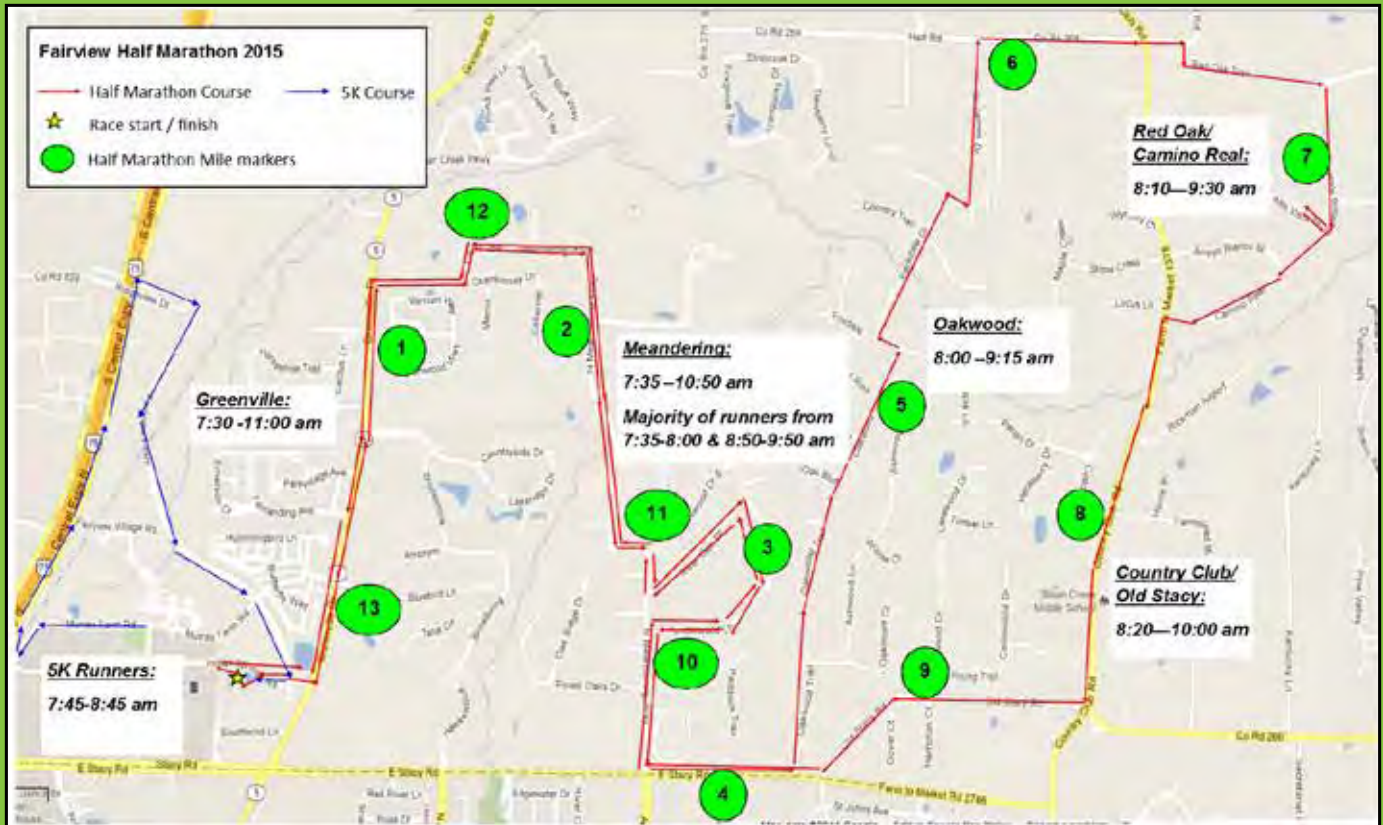

Boards and Commissions

Openings on the Town's Boards and Commissions

Interested in getting involved in serving your community? The Town utilizes numerous citizen run boards and committees to ensure public input and participation in the Town's decision-making process.

To be eligible, individuals must be a registered voter of the town, may not be in arrears on property taxes and must complete an "Application to Serve." Find the application at fairviewtexas.org by selecting "Boards and Commissions" from the "Government" dropdown. The Town Council reviews all applications and votes on all board appointments and reappointments. Board members are typically appointed for two-year terms.

At press time, there were openings on the Technology Advisory Committee, Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, Special Events Committee and openings for alternates on the Zoning Board of Adjustments. If residents apply for a board without any current openings, their application will be kept on file with the Town Secretary's office for future openings. Completed applications can be emailed to ecappon@fairviewtexas.org.

Bulk items may be placed outside no earlier than 5 p.m. the Friday before your designated Monday and must be out by 7 a.m. on Monday. Republic Services will pick up bulk items between Monday and Friday on your designated week. See the color coded chart shown here for more details. If your regular trash/recycle pick-up day or bulk Monday falls on a holiday, service will resume the following business day. Bulk/brush is limited to 12 cubic yards or four truck loads.
