At the October 6, 2015 regular Town Council meeting, the Town Council addressed the following items:

- Approved the minutes from the September 1, 2015 regular Town Council meeting.
- Approved a resolution placing in nomination the name of Gary Rodenbaugh for membership on the Board of Directors of the Collin County Central Appraisal District.
- Approved a request by Kittyhawk LLC for approval of a Concept Plan Amendment for a proposed single family attached (townhome) residential development on a 6.5± acre tract of land that is situated in the John A. Taylor Survey, Abstract No. 909, zoned Commercial Planned Development District (CPDD), Neighborhood General Sub-District, and is generally located west of the intersection of SH 5 and Meandering Way. (CPA2015-01).
- Approved a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) in order to allow for the construction of an accessory building on a property that is zoned Two-Acre Ranch Estate (RE-2) and is specifically located at 1281 Stacy Rd, being Lot 1, Block A of the Roberts Addition to the Town of Fairview. (ZA2015-12).
- Approved a request made by 84 Acres Red Oak Trail, LLC to rezone a 31.63± acres segment of land which is part of an 83.99± acres tract of land that is zoned Agricultural (AG) and is situated in the GB Pilant Survey, Abstract No. 691, and generally located at the eastern terminus of Red Oak Trail and north of the Montecito Estates #2 Addition, to the Planned Center (PC) Zoning District. (ZA2014-01).
- Discussed utility billing issues related to high water volumes.
- Authorized the Town Manager to enter into an agreement with Larry Kline Consulting for the development of a Tax Increment Financing District.
- Approved a request by M. Christopher Custom Homes for approval of a Final Plat for the Harper Landing Addition, a proposed residential neighborhood comprised of 13 single-family residential lots on a 28.934± acre tract of land situated in the Robert Fitzhugh Survey Abstract No. 317 and that is generally located east of Farmstead Road and 1,600 north of Stacy Road. The subject property is zoned Two-Acre Ranch Estate (RE-2). (FP2015-05).
- Approved a resolution setting a public hearing to adopt amended land use assumptions, capital improvements plan and possibly amend the current impact fees. The Public Hearing is set for Tuesday, December 1 at 7:30 p.m.
- Approved a resolution creating and appointing members to a Capital Improvements Advisory Committee.
- Discussed a report from Staff on the Gus Macker 3-on-3 Basketball Tournament.

Thanksgiving Fire Safety

The holiday season is quickly approaching and the Fairview Fire Department would like to remind you of a few fire safety tips for while you are working in the kitchen this Thanksgiving:

- Always call 911 right away if a fire occurs.
- Don't cook food overnight in the oven or on the stovetop.
- Don't leave a stove unattended when cooking.
- Never deep-fry a *frozen* turkey.

- Always keep a fire extinguisher handy while deep-frying a turkey.
- Be careful not to overfill a turkey pot with oil or grease.
- Keep children away from hot stovetops and flammable items, spills can cause burns and kitchen fires.
- Don't wear long sleeve clothing when cooking near an open flame.
- Never use water to extinguish a grease fire.
- If a fire ignites in the oven, keep the door closed and turn the heat source off.

Heard Museum Happenings







Explore the Heard at Night

Saturday, November 14 at 6 p.m., guests are invited to explore the thrilling sights, smells and sounds of night at the Heard Natural Science Museum & Wildlife Sanctuary along with knowledgeable Heard Trail Guides. Hikers that have hit a trail after sunset know that experienc-

ing even familiar trails at night can be a completely different experience than during the day. Night hikers will be encouraged to sharpen their senses to be able to spot signs of animal life and learn more about the inhabitants of the Heard.

Preregistration is required for all night hikes. Closed toed shoes, long pants and bug spray are recommended. Participants should bring a flashlight with a red lens on it to protect night vision while looking for nocturnal animals. Program fees are \$14 for the public and \$12 for Heard Museum members (ages 3 through adult). Hikes are at least an hour long with varied terrain and may not be suitable for children under 5 years. Children ages 18 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Admission for toddlers and infants 2 years and under is free, but they must be in a carrier or backpack as strollers are prohibited.

Holidays at the Heard

On December 12, 18 and 19 from 6:30 to 9 p.m. families can enjoy the most unique holiday event in North Texas, Holidays at the Heard. Holidays at the Heard brings the beauty of the holiday season into nature. Bundle up and come enjoy the lights and holiday décor along the half-mile nature trail found at the Heard Natural Science Museum and Wildlife Sanctuary.

Children and the young at heart will enjoy the opportunity to have a photo taken with Father Christmas and Mother Nature. Local musicians will delight audiences with live holiday music in the Heard outdoor amphitheater and strolling carolers will entertain guests as they walk through the grounds.



Daylight Saving Time ends on Sunday, November 1 at 2:00 a.m. So, as we fall back an hour, it is important to realize that more joggers and cyclists will be on residential roads during night hours. Studies have found that car accidents go up after we turn the clocks back, besides the decreased visibility, commuting in the dark can make drivers drowsier than usual. Here are some tips for staying safe, both in the great outdoors and on the road.

Tips for Pedestrians:

- Wear light colored clothing.
- Carry a small LED flashlight in your hand and point it at the ground as you move along. A quick wave of the light at any approaching car may get the driver's attention.
- Ensure bike safety reflectors and lights are working properly.
- Stay alert. If you use a headset, keep the volume low enough to hear oncoming traffic.
- Remember that riding or running down the middle of the road puts you in harm's way with less time to react.
- If you are uncomfortable with oncoming traffic, stop and step off the road and wait for vehicles to pass. Do not try to keep moving on dark or uneven ground.
- If you bring your dog(s) at night, keep them on a short leash in the presence of oncoming traffic.

Tips for Drivers:

- As a driver, assume people are on the streets at all hours.
- Clean headlights, taillights, signal lights, mirror faces and windows once a week. Clean your windows on the inside and outside.
- Make sure headlights are properly aimed; misaimed headlights blind other drivers and reduce your ability to see the road.
- If there is any doubt of visibility, turn your headlights on. Remember that being seen is as important as seeing.
- Reduce your speed and increase your following distance at night.
- Avoid glare from oncoming bright headlights by watching the right edge of the road and using that as your steering guide.
- If you have car trouble, pull off the road as far as possible. Turn on emergency flashers and the interior dome light. Stay off the roadway and get passengers away from the area.

Tip: When you change your clocks, it is also a great time to change the batteries in smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors.

STACY ROAD UPDATE

TxDOT is directing the construction firm to begin work on the section of Stacy Road between State Highway 5 and Meandering Way/Angel Parkway. The work will begin on the Fairview side; they will clear the right of way and begin doing underground culvert (drainage) work in the low areas. Once the culverts are ready, they will begin the installation of the northern two concrete lanes, while keeping the other two asphalt lanes open. The relocation of utilities caused delays in beginning the actual road widening work. Much of the overhead electrical work as well as underground gas lines, overhead/underground telecommunications lines and water lines had to be relocated. Stacy Road will be a four-lane divided roadway when the widening of both sides of the road is complete.





The 2015 Showdown Half Marathon and 5K

The fourth annual Showdown Half Marathon and 5K was held on Saturday, October 10 in Fairview. The race has become a popular event among runners because of the scenic course, great local support, local hospitality and the reputation of race director, Libby Jones.

This year's race had 868 finishers of the 5K and half marathon. The overall 5K male winner was 16-year-old Omar Velez and Kisha Littrell was the female winner. The 5K masters winner was Dan Yarbrough in the male division and Robin Dunlap in the female division.

The overall half marathon winners were Stephen Vrska and Carma Barnett. The half marathon masters winner was Jeffrey Christian in the male division and Nicki Cave was the female masters' winner.

The single best method of flu prevention is being vaccinated and this season's flu shot contains two strains not found in the shot from last season. Remember that it can take up to two weeks for the shot to begin working, so get your shot as soon as possible.

Once you have gotten the shot, here are some additional tips to help you stay healthy this winter:

- The flu virus can survive for up to a day on surfaces, so wash your hands frequently with soap and water or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Try a saline nasal spray or neti pot to clean out germs before they reach your immune system.
- Frequently disinfect areas that are frequently touched that could easily become contaminated with germs such as the flu.
- Open a window. Fresh air helps keep airborne particles circulating, rather than on you.
- If you start to feel sick, try Zinc. Studies have shown taking Zinc at the onset of

- cold symptoms reduces the time you are sick.
- Think before you touch! The average person touches their mouth, nose or eyes several times an hour; germs quickly spread this way.
- Avoid contact and talking with those who are coughing and sneezing. Germs from a sneeze can travel up to 20 feet!
- Eat yogurt. Those same probiotics and live cultures that help aid digestion have also been shown to decrease healing time in those who were already sick and reduce respiratory infections.
- Get some rest! Studies have shown that people who sleep less than 7 hours per night are almost three times as likely to get sick as those who are well rested.
- Practice healthy living habits. Eating right, being active, managing stress and drinking more water have all been shown to help prevent illness.
- If you think you have the flu, see a doctor right away. Prescription flu medicine works best when taken during the first 48 hours of becoming symptomatic.



NATIONAL TAKE-BACK DAY


Fairview hit a new Town record during their 2015 National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day event held September 26, having collected 272 pounds of potentially dangerous controlled substances from the residents of Fairview. This was the highest weight collected yet at a Fairview Take-Back Day and made the Town one of the top collectors in the region.



Nationally this was the tenth National Take Back Day since the biannual program was launched by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) in 2010. Across the U.S., Americans properly disposed of more than 350 tons of unused or expired medications.

National Take Back Day not only helps prevent the leading cause of accidental poisoning to both humans and pets; it also helps prevent prescription drug abuse, as most teens that abuse medications, found them in their home medicine cabinet.

Of the 46,000 drug-related deaths in America annually, more than half are from prescription opioids or heroin, and four out of five heroin users begin their addiction with prescription medication. Additionally, properly disposing of medications prevents pollution to the water supply and any resulting impact to aquatic species.
