BURN BAN

Effective July 11, 2022, the Town of Fairview has implemented a burn ban. The Collin County Fire Marshal also issued the same burn ban earlier this month for all unincorporated areas of Collin County. This burn ban will remain in place until further notice for all properties within the Town of Fairview.

During normal times when a burn ban is not in effect, Fairview has restrictions on open burning but allows for residents on 10+ acres to conduct agricultural burns (with a Town issued permit) and allows for private home barbecue grills and barbecue pits to be used. During this burn ban, only private home-type



barbecue grills will be permitted to be used. This ban includes burning of brush and natural vegetation on any land parcel and in any outdoor fire pit or container regardless of size. A propane grill/fire pit is still allowed, as it does not release embers that may spread and cause fires.

HEARD HAPPENINGS



Explore the Heard at Night

Hikers that have found themselves on a trail after sunset know that experiencing a trail at night can be a completely different experience from hiking during the day. Landmarks change, as can a hiker's sense of direction. Even a familiar trail can feel completely different at night.

On November 12, at 6 p.m. guests are invited to explore the thrilling sights, smells, and sounds of night at Heard Natural Science Museum & Wildlife Sanctuary with Heard Trail Guides. Night hikers will be encouraged to sharpen their senses to be able to spot signs of animal life and learn more about the inhabitants of the Heard.

Preregistration is required for all night hikes. Tickets are \$14 for the public and \$12 for Heard Museum members (ages 3 through adult). Closed toed shoes, long pants, and bug spray are recommended. Participants should bring a flashlight with a red lens on it to protect your night vision while looking for nocturnal animals.

Children ages 18 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Hikes are at least an hour long and include varied terrain and



may not be suitable for children under 5 years. Admission for toddlers and infants 2 years and under is free, but they must be in a carrier or backpack. Strollers are prohibited.



Finn Murphy and The Long Haul

Known by his trucker handle "U-Turn," Finn Murphy has moved household goods

across the country for 30 years. This affords him a unique window into the souls of his clients.

Some customers yell "Be careful!" repeatedly, as if their harsh admonitions are going to al-



ter his course of action. Other clients leave the house and do not return until he has all their items on the truck. Some customers offer lunch while others do not provide a meal even though the nearest drive-through is fifteen miles away.

Murphy is also the author of *THE LONG HAUL: A Trucker's Tale of Life on the Road*. A review in *The New York Times* described his book as "almost shamefully enjoyable." Murphy will speak at the Allen Public Library 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Oct.13, which will also be web-cast live on allentx.swagit.com.

During the day, Finn is loading furniture onto a truck, but in the evening, he might be reading Jane Austen's *Mansfield Park* or Cormac McCarthy's *Outer Dark* in a dilapidated motel room. With his diverse interests and experiences, Finn offers a nuanced assessment of the American experience in his thought-provoking book.

"I've driven my rig all around Texas over and over and seen the signs for Allen many times," Murphy points out. "I'm really looking forward to actually stopping in Allen for a few days rather than passing through on my way to somewhere else. See you in October."

Former FEC Chair Ann Ravel

Former chair of the Federal Elections Commission (FEC) Ann Ravel will speak at the Allen Public Library 3:00 p.m. Saturday, October 15. Admission to the program is free, and it will be web-casted live on allentx. swagit.com

Appointed to the FEC by President Obama in 2013, Ms. Ravel discovered that candidates from both primary political parties are benefitting from funds that originate in foreign countries. During her tenure on the FEC, Ms. Ravel became gravely concerned about the money flooding our elections from foreign countries. These funds, running into the hundreds of millions of dollars, aid in muffling the voice of the American people.

Ravel indicates that this isn't American

dollars, because these funds emanate from foreign countries and are filtered through domestic corporations. In May 2015, Ravel told *The New York Times* that it is unlikely the FEC



will be able to regulate upcoming elections. "The likelihood of the laws being enforced is slim," she told *The New York Times*. "I never want to give up, but I'm not under any illusions. People think the FEC is dysfunctional. It's worse than dysfunctional."

Ravel resigned from the FEC in 2017 and is currently serving as a Professor at the University of California, Berkeley School of Law.

Lovejoy ISD to Hold Voter-Approved Tax Rate Election (VATRE)

On November 8, 2022, Lovejoy ISD will hold a Voter-Approved Tax Rate Election (VATRE) to consider increasing the M&O portion of the 2022 ISD tax rate by 3.17 cents. Due to tax rate compression, Lovejoy ISD's 2022-2023 Tax Rate will decrease with or without the passing of the VATRE. The passing of the VATRE would generate approximately \$640,000 in additional funding for Lovejoy ISD. Property tax rates for homeowners 65 years and older with the appropriate exemptions will not be impacted by the VATRE.

Priorities for the VATRE include employee compensation and restoring the fund balance.


Prior to calling for a VATRE, Lovejoy ISD engaged in an extensive budget analysis which included:

- Formation of a 40 Member Stakeholder-Based Financial Sustainability Committee
- Assessment of Current State
 - » Demographic Study
 - Staffing Efficiency Study



- **Program Reviews**
- » Capacity Assessment
- Implementation of Zero-Based Budgeting
- Development of a three (3) year Financial Forecast

The financial sustainability measures taken in the last year, including the work of the stakeholder-based Financial Sustainability Committee, are provided in more detail in the graphic. Current financial projections show a \$44,527 deficit in FY24 with 100 days of fund balance, \$1,045,556 deficit in FY25 with 86 days of fund balance, and \$2,137,508 in FY26 with 65 days of fund balance. A baseline of 90 days and target of 120 days of fund balance are benchmarks for addressing district cash flow needs. Fairview Construction Project Updates

TxDOT will begin the reconstruction of the Ridgeview Overpass from the 2 lane to a 4 lane overpass with pedestrian access this September. The frontage roads on US75 will be raised at Ridgeview like the Parker Rd frontage roads. This overpass will connect to Fairview Pkwy as it does now. The town is seeking funding from Collin County this Fall for the continuation of Fairview Pkwy North from the Ridgeview Overpass to Medical Center Drive. If we are successful, the funding would be a 70/30 county/city split. The county's bond sale in 2023 is not a very large one, however, so we will be competing with a lot of other projects. TxDOT will also begin the addition of 3 foot safety shoulders on FM1378 from Stacy Rd to SH5 in October. It will also include a new left turn lands at Hart Rd/Red Oak Trail and the Sloan Creek Intermediate School. We have also requested for TxDOT to improve the slippery when wet surface on SH5 on the sharp curve just North of Sloan Creek at the old RR bridge. They are looking at solutions. A new traffic signal will be constructed on FM1378 at Stoddard Rd in 2023.

A new regional sewer lift station is being



constructed as a 3 way partnership between Fairview, Allen and the North Texas Municipal Water District. You may have seen the red crane over the trees just East of US75 and South of Spur 399. This will provide the ultimate capacity needed for the commercial district.

The town will be bidding out the extension of Country Club Rd West to US75/Spur 399 this Fall. We received a \$3 million Federal EDA grant towards this project. Construction will start just after the first of the year with about a year to construct. The town has approved a project to

design the reconstruction of Hart Rd to the 30% stage and to see what the cost is projected to be. If the funding can be determined, the town will hold stakeholder meetings and to get the designs to the 100% level for construction. At this time, the project is not funded.

Orr Road from Stacy Rd to the entrance to the NTMWD wastewater treatment plant has been reconstructed to concrete and is complete. There is now a concrete road from the sewer plant all the way to US75 along with bike lanes and trails in most areas.



COLLECTION SCHEDULES

Trash, recycling and yard trimmings are collected weekly on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday if all items are placed inside the cart with lid closed. Please have trash and recycling carts out by 7 a.m.

Bulk waste and loose brush are collected once a month. Please refer to the map on the previous page to determine your pick up week. Bulk trash may be put out after 6 p.m. on the Friday before collection but no later than 7 a.m. on Monday of your collection week. Bulk trash may be picked up anytime during the collection week. **See #7 in the guidelines on next page for size limits**.



REMEMBER THESE SIMPLE GUIDELINES FOR PUTTING YOUR TRASH OUT

- 1. Place carts on the edge of the street/alley with handles facing the house and with the lids opening to the street/alley.
- 2. Keep carts two to three feet apart and away from fences, cars, gates, gas meters, etc...
- 3. All trash should be contained in securely tied plastic bags. All bags should fit into the cart with the lid closed.
- 4. Do not place hazardous household waste in your cart.
- 5. Place your carts out by 7 a.m. on pick up day; carts should not be left out after 6 a.m. the following day.
- 6. Do not place any items outside your carts; unless it's for bulk pick up.
- 7. Bulk and brush should be cut in four foot lengths and neatly stacked, you are allowed 12 cubic yards per month, 1 cubic yard is approximately the size of a washing machine.


