




look. It's an amazing experience performing in a beloved Christmas movie adapted into a musical, and it's just a really joyful show".



BUSINESS SPOTLIGHT

Life Skills, Behavior Change and Success Stories: Meet a Fairview business with a mission focused on improving lives one child at a time

Receiving an autism diagnosis for your child can be a scary, confusing, and overwhelming time. Navigating the early years, when intervention is considered most successful, is difficult, and many families feel lost and alone. Trying to decipher which is the best route for your child can seem like a puzzle, and attempting to do it alone is isolating and frustrating for both the parents and the children.

ut there is a place in Fairview here to help. Life Skills Autism Academy in Fairview is an early intervention therapy center specializing in Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA). It is an intensive, personalized, and high-commitment program designed to help children on the autism spectrum reach their greatest potential. They do this by using individualized, one-on-one programs

that break down larger routine tasks into smaller, easier-tomanage steps that can be learned, repeated, and rewarded. ABA has been shown to help children with autism improve their communication abilities, daily living skills, and social behaviors necessary to thrive in school, home, and community.

The Certified Behavior Analysts (CBAs) at Life Skills Academy are specially trained in Applied Behavior Therapy, the





most effective therapy for individuals living with autism. Through this early intervention program for 2-6 year-olds, the CBAs meet with families to create and implement customized treatment plans based on the specific goals and needs of the child. They continually monitor progress, adjusting and altering the plan as they go, ensuring that the child is ready and equipped to transition into school. This intensive program is a hefty commitment, but it is worth it to help the child reach their potential.

"Unlike preschool, which usually is a few hours a day, Life Skills Autism Academy requires a commitment of 35 to 40 hours a week. The idea isn't to "fix" people with autism but rather to change behaviors that can cause difficulty and ultimately impede independence and quality of life for the whole family. The investment is intense and early in a child's development so that the need for services tapers and is complete in two or three years," explains Amy Cook, Clinical Director, and Fairview resident.

The entire individualized program, built upon decades of evidence-based research, is specifically designed to fulfill the mission of Life Skills Academy—to help children with autism write their own success stories.

Life Skills Academy opened its first center in Plano in 2019. With that launch, the demand was overwhelming, and it quickly became apparent that expansion to adjacent areas was critical to the overall health and well-being of the community. With autism rates rising, many communities are underserved and desperate for qualified providers. With this need in mind, they chose Fairview for their second location. President Eric Labe says, "We launched our first center in Plano, Texas, in 2019. Since then, we have seen overwhelming demand in the adjacent areas. With the rate of autism growing to 1 in 44 children, we understood the need to expand our locations to meet those needs and continue to live up to our mission. We love the Fairview community and look forward to providing these services to its patrons."

Since opening the Fairview location, demand has increased, and Life Skills Academy now has eight locations throughout Texas, Arizona, and Indiana, with more planned throughout 2022-23. Regardless of their expansion plans and dreams of growth, though, Life Skills Academy hopes to remain true to its mission and to keep its sole focus on the ones that matter most, the patients and their families, and to continue to improve lives one child at a time.

Plan a Nature Experience for Your Group

Special events are available at the Heard throughout the year and make a great group outing. Choose from Holidays at the Heard (December 9-10, 2022) and more.

Group overnight stays at the Heard offer groups an evening of fantastic discovery after hours! Our programs consist of teambuilding activities, educational presentations, and the opportunity to experience Texas wildlife. Our programs are specifically customized based on your group's interests.

The Heard Ropes Course offers prescheduled Zip Line Days in which small groups or individuals are welcome to participate. Groups of 10 or more can

Since the start of the new school year, the Green Team has been implementing several new programs, including: cafeteria recycling, share tables to reduce food waste, tray stacking and enhanced classroom recycling.

The Green Team has also helped to implement Green Team student clubs on all campuses to provide an opportunity for students to help with campus recycling and garden projects. We have significantly reduced trash volume going into landfills, increased recycling on all campuses

and brought awareness to students, staff and parents on ways they can be kinder to the environment.



Trash, Bulk and Brush Collection



COLLECTION SCHEDULES

Trash, recycling and yard trimmings are collected weekly on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday if all items are placed inside the cart with lid closed. Please have trash and recycling carts out by 7 a.m.


Bulk waste and loose brush are collected once a month. Please refer to the map on the previous page to determine your pick up week. Bulk trash may be put out after 6 p.m. on the Friday before collection but no later than 7 a.m. on Monday of your collection week. Bulk trash may be picked up anytime during the collection week. **See #7 in the guidelines on next page for size limits.**

2022 Holidays: Trash, recycling, bulk and brush will not be picked up on the holidays listed below; instead the collection will slide one day after the holiday-unless otherwise noted.

January 1, New Year's Day - No effect May 30, Memorial Day - Roll Foward One Day July 4, Independence Day - Roll Foward One Day September 5, Labor Day - Roll Foward One Day November 24, Thanksgiving - No effect December 25, Christmas Day - No effect

Missed Collections/Damaged Carts: Call Republic Services at 972-422-2341 to schedule a pick up for a missed collection or to report a damaged cart.

Hazardous Waste: Residents may dispose of household hazardous waste at the Home Chemical Collection Center located in Dallas. Call 214-553-1765 for information.



REMEMBER THESE SIMPLE GUIDELINES FOR PUTTING YOUR TRASH OUT

- 1. Place carts on the edge of the street/alley with handles facing the house and with the lids opening to the street/alley.
- 2. Keep carts two to three feet apart and away from fences, cars, gates, gas meters, etc...
- 3. All trash should be contained in securely tied plastic bags. All bags should fit into the cart with the lid closed.
- 4. Do not place hazardous household waste in your cart.
- 5. Place your carts out by 7 a.m. on pick up day; carts should not be left out after 6 a.m. the following day.
- 6. Do not place any items outside your carts; unless it's for bulk pick up.
- 7. Bulk and brush should be cut in four foot lengths and neatly stacked, you are allowed 12 cubic yards per month, 1 cubic yard is approximately the size of a washing machine.
