n last month's article, I shared that your Town Council is committed to serving Fairview with wisdom, compassion and a shared dedication to preserving the values that make our community unique. This month, I am pleased to share several updates that reflect our commitment.

Welcoming Council Member Lakia Works

The Town Council recently appointed Lakia Works to fill the vacant Seat 6 position, created when I was elected mayor. Ms. Works has been a dedicated volunteer in Fairview, serving for several years on the Planning and Zoning Commission. She will now serve on the Town Council for the remainder of the current term, which expires in 2026.

Ms. Works brings energy, experience and a deep love for our Town. Lakia shares our passion for thoughtful leadership and preserving the charm and character of Fairview. Please join me in welcoming Lakia Works to the Town Council!

Protecting Fairview's Identity

One important way we are working to preserve Fairview's unique identity is by continuing the effort to secure our own ZIP Code. Currently, Fairview shares the 75069 ZIP Code with McKinney, which has resulted in mail service issues and many other challenges. The shared ZIP Code has at times created confusion and diluted our Town's visibility. While past attempts have not been successful, there is promising progress.

Thanks to the persistence of Mayor Pro Tem Gregg Custer and Assistant Town Manager Adam Wilbourn, U.S. House Bill H.R. 3095 — introduced in April 2025 — directs the U.S. Postal Service to designate unique ZIP Codes for 68 communities across the country, including Fairview. The bill was reported out of the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee in late May and is now awaiting action in the U.S. House of Representatives. If passed by the House, H.R. 3095 would make its way to the U.S. Senate for consideration. A special thank you to U.S. Representative Keith Self for cosponsoring H.R. 3095 and ensuring that Fairview was included in the bill.

The Town is currently reviewing its development regulations. This review aims to ensure development regulations continue to promote Fairview's long-term vision and the quality standards that have made Fairview a unique and desirable place to live.

Celebrating Community Spirit and Generosity

Fairview's residents are compassionate and generous, and I am inspired by you.

Registration and a silent auction begin at 7 a.m., and I am proud to be participating alongside many of you this year. Last year, the Ranchers for the Cure team raised nearly \$70,000-a testament to your giving spirit. Visit the Community Events section on the Town website for full details.

Community Advocacy in Action

A federal court petition has been filed by the North Texas Conservation Association (NTCA), a group comprised largely of McKinney and Fairview residents. The petition challenges the environmental assessment related to the McKinney

National Airport expansion, arguing that TxDOT underestimated long-term impacts on air quality, noise pollution and endangered species. We will continue to monitor developments and advocate for thoughtful, community-minded solutions.

Join Us for Breakfast or Brunch with the Mayor

We are continuing "Breakfast with the Mayor" meetings starting August 8 at Heritage Ranch. These informal gatherings will be held at 7:30 a.m. on the Friday following the Town Council's regular meeting, which is the first Tuesday of each month.

Beginning in September we will have a new opportunity to connect. The first "Brunch with the Mayor" will take place from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on

Wednesday, September 24 at Neon Cactus in Fairview Town Center. Brunch locations will rotate quarterly to support and spotlight different local businesses.

There is no agenda for these gatherings. My goal is to share updates on what's happening in Fairview and, more importantly, listen to you. Through public service, legislative advocacy, and community engagement, we continue to build a Town that honors its heritage while preparing for the future. Town Council Meeting


The Town Council held a special meeting with an executive session on May 29, 2025, and appointed Lakia Works to Seat 6 of the Fairview Town Council.

At the Tuesday, June 3, 2025, regular Town Council meeting, the Council:

- Approved/authorized the following items on the consent agenda:
 - Minutes of the May 6, 2025, regular meeting of the Town Council
 - Minutes of May 29, 2025, special meeting of the Town Council
- Received staff monthly police, fire, code enforcement and construction project reports from staff

- Held a public hearing and approved a conditional use permit for a sports court at 61 Seattle Slew, a 3.6-acre site zoned for the (RE-2) Two-acre Ranch Estate District.
- Held a public hearing and approved a conditional use permit for a carport at 491 Bluebird, a 0.49-acre site zoned for the (RE-1) One-acre Ranche Estate District.
- Scheduled a budget work session for 2 p.m. July 31. A public hearing for the budget and tax rate will be held at 7 p.m. Aug. 18, and a vote on the budget and tax rate will take place at 3 p.m. Aug. 25.
- Appointed Gene Borsattino to the Economic Development Corporation and Community Development Corporation Board of Directors.





Volunteers Like You are the Stars

he Town of Fairview has been honored with Silver Star status as part of the Keep Texas Beautiful program, and the distinction is largely thanks to our residents for their participation in Town-wide cleanups, household hazardous waste collection and paper shredding events.

The programs have grown, as more volunteers join the effort each year.

"Keep Texas Beautiful affiliates are the heart of our mission, and we are proud to recognize those that go above and beyond," said Suzanne Kho, Executive Director of Keep Texas Beautiful. "We are proud to recognize those who go the extra mile to create cleaner, greener and more beautiful communities.

"Silver Star Affiliates are actively engaging local residents, leading cleanups, promoting sustainability and making a lasting impact."

To earn Silver Star status, affiliates must showcase strong organizational capacity, community involvement and a commitment to the Keep Texas Beautiful mission. This includes demonstrating economic development efforts and community outreach.

Fairview's Town-wide cleanup sponsored by the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board was canceled in April because of rain.

Still, the wet April weather didn't keep more than 350 participants away from the Public Works Yard for household hazardous waste collection and paper shredding.

Residents dropped off environmentally hazardous waste – like 400 pounds of old alkaline batteries, several tons of chemicals and containers full of fluorescent bulbs. Nearly three tons of documents were shredded.

In 2024, about 50 volunteers fanned out across parks, trails and roadsides in Town to pick up trash, and nearly 400 vehicles rolled through the Fairview Public Works Yard as part of the annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection and Document Shredding events.



Make **Safety** Part of **Summer Traditions**

July 4 marks the height of summer fun. Safeguard your family's holiday celebrations by remembering these important tips:

1. Vacation Watch

Vacation House Watch Service is available to residents of Fairview who will be away from their homes on vacation. A minimum duration of two days is required for a house watch.

The maximum duration of time your house will be checked is one month, and there is no guarantee that your house can be checked daily based on call volume. You are limited to eight weeks of house watch services per calendar year.

Apartments are NOT eligible for this service, and homes must be currently occupied. If anyone will be staying overnight for any period of this time, that house is NOT eligible. The house will be checked daily if call volume allows.

To request a Vacation House Watch, fill out a form on the police department web page.

Upon returning home, please email us housewatch@ fairviewtexas.org to let the Police Department know you have returned.

2. Ban on Fireworks

Thousands of injuries are reported annually from sparklers and other seemingly harmless novelties purchased from fireworks stands. Many of those injuries involve children.

Fireworks pose a significant safety hazard for you, your family and pets, nearby structures and our natural surroundings. The Fairview Fire Marshal and the Police Department enforce the Town's fireworks prohibition.

If you want to enjoy fireworks this summer, take in one of the professional shows organized by our surrounding communities.



Construction Updates Fairview Crossing is Open


Fairview Crossing, a new east-west thoroughfare connecting Country Club Road with Spur 399, east of the Sam Rayburn Tollway, opened to traffic on Thursday, May 22. Drivers may now use Fairview Crossing to access



Medical Center Drive, State Highway 5, Country Club Road and Spur 399.

Drivers traveling northbound on U.S. 75 may take the frontage road exit south of Sam Rayburn Tollway and stay on the access road as it curves east into Spur 399. Drivers heading northbound on State Highway 5 may use a dedicated left turn lane to access Fairview Crossing.

Fairview Crossing was built to align with future improvements the Texas Department of Transportation has planned for State Highway 5.



Ridgeview

Access to Ridgeview Drive from Fairview Parkway is scheduled to be available beginning in mid-June with the completion of construction of the intersection.

Fairview Parkway

Work continues to progress on the northern extension of Fairview Parkway, which will ultimately align with Medical Center Drive at Fairview Crossing. Construction is estimated to be complete in Summer 2026.

Answers to Your Weighty (and Bulky) Questions

If your old couch or washing machine is beyond salvage and even charitable organizations don't want it, what now?

Republic Services will pick up most household goods during your assigned bulk waste collection week as long as the combined volume of the items you leave at the curb **doesn't exceed 12 cubic yards.** Be sure to factor in any brush you might be leaving out for pickup too, because it counts toward the maximum volume. (See the illustration for tips on calculating volume.)





Here are a few **simple rules** to keep in mind when leaving bulk waste at the curb for pickup:

- Brush and limbs should be cut into four-foot lengths and neatly stacked.
- Mattresses should be wrapped in plastic for safe disposal.
- Leave furniture, such as chairs or sofas, fully assembled.
- Remove doors from appliances like refrigerators and washing machines.
- Freon must be removed from appliances that contain them, and

those items must be tagged by a licensed professional.

• Place bulk items at the curb before 7 a.m. Monday on your designated collection week and no earlier than 6 p.m. the Friday before your collection week.

What's not eligible for bulk pickup?

- · Household hazardous waste
- Tires
- Construction material
- Concrete

Grill Fires Peak in July

There's nothing like outdoor grilling, especially for family gatherings. But a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard and a source of injuries. Learn simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

The National Fire Protection Association gathered these statistics from recent years:


- July is the peak month for grill fires.
- Grills had not been cleaned in roughly one-fifth of reported fires.
- More than one-quarter of grill structure fires started on an exterior balcony or open porch. Eight percent began when an outside wall caught fire.
- Gas grills are involved in an average of 9,287 home fires each year, including 4,682 structure fires and 4,605 outdoor fires. Leaks or breaks were primarily a problem with gas grills. Six percent of gas grill structure fires and 13% of outside gas grill fires were caused by leaks or breaks.
- According to data from the Consumer Product Safety Commission, in 2020-2024, an average of 21,682 patients per year went to emergency rooms because of injuries involving grills.

Safety Tips

• For propane grills, check the gas tank for leaks before use. (Watch NFPA's video on how to check for leaks.)



- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Place the grill well away from the home, deck railings, and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grilling area.
- If you use starter fluid when charcoal grilling, only use charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire. When you have or are finished grilling, let the coals cool completely before disposing in a metal container.
- Never leave your grill unattended when in use.



The ABCs of Weekly Trash and Recycling Collection


Remember these tips to ensure efficient trash and recycling pickup:

- **1.** Arrange carts carefully with handles facing your home, lids open toward the street, and 2 feet of space between carts and other objects.
- 2. Be punctual by placing carts at the edge of the street no earlier than 5 p.m. the day before collection and no later than 7 a.m. on collection day. Roll carts back to your house by 6 a.m. the day after pickup.
- **3. Close** lids without clamping or locking. If your trash cart is full, purchase a pink tag for \$2.22 from the Town. Only bags with Town-issued tags will be collected outside carts (except during bulk pickup week).

Did You Know? Empty cardboard boxes don't have to go to the landfill. If they're clean and dry, they can be cut down and folded flat to fit inside your recycling cart.

Avoid Missed Trash Collections

Republic Services has added more drivers, which allows collection of trash and recycling to occur more efficiently. Because of the change, collection trucks may reach your street earlier than in the past.

Please ensure all trash and recycling carts are at the curb no later than 7 a.m. on scheduled collection days to avoid a missed collection.

Other things to keep in mind:

- All trash going to the landfill should be contained inside securely tied plastic bags, and all bags should fit inside your solid blue cart with the lid closed.
 Pink tags may be purchased from the Town for \$2.22 each and placed on excess bags that don't fit inside your trash cart. Other than during bulk
- Prink tags may be purchased from the fown for \$2.22 each and placed on excess bags that don't it inside your trash cart. Other than during but collection weeks, bags sitting outside of carts without a Town-issued tag won't be collected.
 - Recyclables should be placed loose, without bagging, into recycling carts, which are either solid green or dark blue with a lighter blue lid.
- Clean and dry empty cardboard boxes may be cut down and folded flat to fit inside recycling bins.
- Never clamp or lock lids on trash or recycling carts.
- Place carts with handles facing the house and lids opening toward the street or alley.
- Carts must be placed 2 to 3 feet apart and away from objects that may obstruct the pickup arm.
