





Do you know someone who is a Collin County History Preservationist?

Jan Samuels, Collin County Historical Commission

Every year the Collin County Historical Commission hosts an event that celebrates the historical preservation and education efforts in Collin County. Part of that celebration is the recognition of outstanding individuals and groups that have distinguished themselves in such efforts. The awards given are:

Collin McKinney Achievement Award

Recognizes outstanding achievement of a Collin County historical organization or museum that has promoted the heritage of the county with projects, museum education, historical tourism, the erection of tributes to the past and/or the preservation of buildings, publications, or records of historical significance.

Excellence in Historical Education Award

Recognizes an individual or organization that has promoted historical education about Collin County, Texas, through teaching and/or preservation programs benefiting schools, community organizations, and/or the general public.

Leadership in Preservation Award

Recognizes an exemplary Collin County city/town, business or developer that has promoted a respect for the county's past through historical projects and/or renovations of historic buildings or sites.

Living Legacy of Collin County Award

Recognizes the outstanding achievement of an individual citizen of Collin County who has significantly enriched our cultural heritage through a lifetime of dedicated service to the ideals of preservation, education and respect of our rich past.

Young Visionaries Award

Recognizes an individual (18 years of age or less) or youth organization that has significantly contributed to the preservation of Collin County, Texas' historical heritage. Noteworthy activities could include restoration or preservation projects, portrayals of living history, promotion of historical tourism, creation of historical education programs, service hours for a museum, historical organization, or program, and/or other related volunteer efforts.

Please consider the nomination of a group or individual that fits into one of the above categories! The nomination form is available at www.collincountytx.gov/historical_commission. Click on Preservation Celebration. Under Events, click on 2023 Preservation Celebration Nomination Form. The nomination deadline is Friday, April 7, 2023, 4:00 p.m. The award winners will be honored at the Preservation Celebration which will be held on Saturday, April 29 in Celina, Texas.

Tulsa's First Black Television Anchor

Listen to Dale Hogg who made history as Tulsa's first Black TV News anchor at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, February 16 at the Allen Public Library. Admission to the program is free, and it will be web-cast live at ACTV.org by clicking on the WATCH button.

As editor of *Impact* Magazine, Hogg published the first commemorative stories on the 1921 Tulsa Race Riot, and he was the first black member of the University of Tulsa board of trustees. Also, he served on numerous boards, including the Catholic Advisory Council and American Red Cross. Eventually, Hogg went into the corporate world and lived in several cities across the U.S. He became vice president at Time Warner, regional director at Coca-Cola Co., corporate manager at W.R. Grace and Co., and vice president and corporate officer of Iridium.

Larry "T-Byrd" Gordon Band

Celebrate Black History Month with the Dr. Larry "T-Byrd" Gordon Band at 7:30 p.m. Friday February 17, at the Allen Public Library. Admission to the program is free, and it will be web-cast live at ACTV.org by clicking on the WATCH button.

Coyote Meadow **Work Day** Wrap-up

On Saturday, December 3, Fairview Parks & Rec Board members Katherine Ponder and

Renee Powell oversaw an effort to seed wildflowers and create a shade garden at the Coyote Meadow / Roadrunner Trail area. Both projects were approved at the November 2022 Town Council meeting. The meadow was formerly listed as Coyote Park, and the new name will be officially designated with new signs in the coming weeks.

The Public Works team headed up by Aron Holmgren completed some advance work, including thinning trees by Roadrunner Trail at Meandering Way, delivering plants and mulch, creating a walkable mow path in the meadow, and providing equipment for the workday.

With months of planning and advice from Collin County Master Gardeners, the project got underway. Volunteers from nearby neighborhoods including Cypress Crossing and The Domain assisted by spreading wildflower seeds along the paved Roadrunner Trail and the new mow path in the meadow. Visitors are encouraged to walk on the mow path to get new views of the meadow.

The shade garden is now complete, with hardy Texas natives, adapted plants, and bare-root plant starts that will thrive beginning this spring. All were carefully selected by Master Gardeners to be low-maintenance, shade-tolerant, and drought resistant.



Master Gardener Jenny Nelson, who provided knowledge and plants, advised, "There's an expression, 'The first year a native garden sleeps, the second year it creeps, and the third year it leaps." The takeaway is that this spring will show some new life and new colors in the meadow and shade garden; but the real show will be approximately three years away.

Parks & Rec Board Chair Katherine Ponder said, "I really wanted to help this area flourish and provide an even more appealing area for residents. It's such a beautiful area, and the current paved path only skirts the edges. Now people can enjoy it from the start of the trail at Meandering Way, all the way literally through the

meadow with the mow path. I can't wait to see what happens this spring. I know it'll take a while to really see it all come together, but seeing any progress is encouraging."

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the effort. Watch for the area to grow and change as plants come into their own!

"Take a Hike - Explore the Great Outdoors at the Heard Museum"



Trash, recycling and yard trimmings are collected weekly on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday if all items are placed inside the cart with lid closed. Please have trash and recycling carts out by 7 a.m.

Bulk waste and loose brush are collected once a month. Please refer to the map on the previous page to determine your pick up week. Bulk trash may be put out after 6 p.m. on the Friday before collection but no later than 7 a.m. on Monday of your collection week. Bulk trash may be picked up anytime during the collection week. **See #7 in the guidelines on next page for size limits.**


2022 Holidays: Trash, recycling, bulk and brush will not be picked up on the holidays listed below; instead the collection will slide one day after the holiday-unless otherwise noted.

January 1, New Year's Day - No effect May 30, Memorial Day - Roll Foward One Day July 4, Independence Day - Roll Foward One Day September 5, Labor Day - Roll Foward One Day November 24, Thanksgiving - No effect December 25, Christmas Day - No effect

Trash, Bulk and Brush Collection



REMEMBER THESE SIMPLE GUIDELINES FOR PUTTING YOUR TRASH OUT

- 1. Place carts on the edge of the street/alley with handles facing the house and with the lids opening to the street/alley.
- 2. Keep carts two to three feet apart and away from fences, cars, gates, gas meters, etc...
- 3. All trash should be contained in securely tied plastic bags. All bags should fit into the cart with the lid closed.
- 4. Do not place hazardous household waste in your cart.
- 5. Place your carts out by 7 a.m. on pick up day; carts should not be left out after 6 a.m. the following day.
- 6. Do not place any items outside your carts; unless it's for bulk pick up.
- 7. Bulk and brush should be cut in four foot lengths and neatly stacked, you are allowed 12 cubic yards per month, 1 cubic yard is approximately the size of a washing machine.
