## **Stacy Road Update**

The paving of the final two lanes on the Allen side is nearing completion. The traffic switch at Angel Parkway will move to the south west corner on the new concrete so that the south east corner can be completed. The side streets from Allen tying into Stacy will finish up this month as well.

The traffic opening up onto the complete four lanes will most likely occur in late January or early February if cold weather doesn't hold up the final pours in early to mid-January.

Continued improvements at SH5 and Stacy will continue in mid-January to provide for two lanes northbound into Fairview and three lanes southbound into Allen, as well as three lanes westbound on Stacy crossing over SH5.



## **Fairview Alarm Permit Renewals**

The Town of Fairview requires all alarm systems in any home or business in Fairview, whether monitored or not, to have a valid Alarm Permit. Alarm Permits must be renewed annually during the month of January.



The residential renewal fee is \$25 and the commercial renewal fee is \$50.

The fee for a new residential permit is

\$50 and a new commercial permit is \$100. If you have an alarm system and do not currently have an Alarm Permit, please contact Officer Gandy at <u>SGandy@FairviewTexas.org</u> or 972-886-4211, ext. 5022.

For those who currently have an alarm permit, online renewal begins January 1. Alarm permits must be renewed by January 31. To renew your permit, simply visit FairviewTexasAlarm. com. On the site, you will need to enter your login name and password. If you are having trouble remembering your login name and/or password, please contact Officer Gandy, do not create a new account if you are having issues accessing your old account. ## **North Texas Food Bank**

The Town of Fairview is committed to ensuring the health, safety and security of all those living in and visiting our community. And, because of this, Mayor Culbertson issued a proclamation at the November, 6, 2018 Town Council Meeting to North Texas Food Bank in honor of the opening of their Perot Family Campus location in Plano.

Founded in 1982, the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB) is a Dallas nonprofit hunger relief organization that distributes donated, purchased and prepared foods. NTFP provides access to more than 190,000 meals each day for hungry children, seniors and families in North Texas through a network of more than 200 Partner Agencies in 13 counties.

According to this year's Feeding America's Map the Meal Gap study, 15.6% of the Town of Fairview suffers from



food insecurity. While NTFB is making steady progress toward closing the hunger gap, much work remains to be done to reach the organization's 10year goal of providing 92 million nutritious meals annually by 2025.

To help achieve that goal the NTFB opened their Perot Family Campus in September. This 230,000 square foot facility houses their food distribution and volunteer operations. The facility will allow NTFB to continue working with partner agencies, such as the Saint Vincent de Paul Food Pantry to impact those living in poverty with or without a home, with or without employment and encourages the public to become involved.

Mayor Culbertson expressed

the Town's appreciation during the presentation, "The Town of Fairview emboldens the efforts of the North Texas Food Bank and the Saint Vincent de Paul Food Pantry for their work to foster understanding, advocacy and collaborative services to those in need and we are thankful to citizens donating time, voice and resources to help the less fortunate."

## **Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week**

At the November 6, 2018 Town Council Meeting Mayor Culbertson issued a proclamation declaring the week of November 10-18 as Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week.

In 2001, the Interagency Council on Homelessness issued a call for municipalities and counties throughout the United States to develop plans to end homelessness and shortly thereafter the Collin County Homeless Coalition was formed. The Town of Fairview is a participant in the Coalition which includes multiple Collin County municipalities as well as nonprofits, faith-based orga-



nizations, students, businesses and concerned citizens.

During the week members

of the Collin County Homeless Coalition hosted community events throughout Collin County to raise awareness and offer residents an opportunity to share their compassion with those experiencing food and shelter insecurities. The week also highlighted the difficulty and loneliness of those living in poverty without a home and encouraged the public to become involved.

National Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week is held annually the week before Thanksgiving to remind us to take action on hunger and homelessness. Fairview Town Council and staff are thankful to citizens donating time and resources to the less fortunate.

At the Tuesday, November 6, 2018, regular Town Council meeting, the Town Council addressed the following items:

- William Carnegie with North Texas Food Bank gave a presentation on hunger in Collin County.
- Mayor Darion Culbertson presented a proclamation declaring the week of November 10 – 18, 2018 as Homelessness Awareness Week in the Town of Fairview.
- Mayor Darion Culbertson presented Arbor Day Proclamation, including Arbor Day presentation by staff to observe Fairview's commitment to preserving its trees and natural beauty.
- Mayor Darion Culbertson presented North Texas Food Bank with a proclamation in honor of the opening of the Perot Family Campus location in Plano.
- Approved the minutes of the October 3, 2018 regular Council meeting.
- Approved the 2018 Tax Roll as submitted by the Collin County Appraisal District.
- Authorized the Town Manager to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with Collin County regarding animal control and shelter services.
- Approved an ordinance abolishing the Environmental Management Advisory Committee.

- Considered and approved the Final Plat for a two (2) lot, single-family subdivision. The 10.7-acre site is located on the north side of Meandering Way, east of Highway 5 and is zoned for the (RE-2) Two-Acre Ranch Estate District. Owners/Applicant: Scott and Lauren Ludlow. (FP2018-02)
- Discussed planning for future town fire facilities including future equipment, design, construction process and any related matters. Approved town staff to meet with consultant.
- Discussed architectural alternative approaches to reduce costs on fire station #1 design and build that are independent of current architect assessment.
- Discussed incurred expenses for design costs of initial fire station #1 design.
- Discussed upcoming Council work session dates and topics.
- Council deferred the discussion of Boards and Commissions until the December meeting.
- Received the Monthly Financial Report for the period ending September 30, 2018.
- Received the Quarterly Financial Report for the period ending September 30, 2018
- Received a Stacy Road update.

The Fairview Police Department has a Special Watch Form that homeowners can use when their home will be vacant for an extended period, such as a vacation.

Residents can fill out a form at the Utility Billing front desk in the Town Hall lobby or submit the form via the Town website. Complete the form online by visiting <u>FairviewTexas.org</u> and selecting the *Special Watch Form* under *Forms* on the *Other Pages* drop down menu. The Fairview Police Department will then contact the requester within two business days to verify the request.

## Town Election Application Deadlines

The Town of Fairview operates under a Council-Manager form of government. The Town Council consists of a Mayor and six Councilmembers that are volunteers elected at-large.

According to the Town of Fairview Charter, no person shall serve as Mayor for more than three successive terms, and no person shall serve as Councilmember for more than three successive terms. Their term of office shall be for a period of two years or any portion thereof.

The Town's next General Election will occur on Saturday, May 4, 2019. The terms of office that will expire in May 2019 are **Town Council Mayor and Town Council Seats 1, 3 and 5**. Town Council Seats 2, 4 and 6 will expire in May 2020.

Potential candidate information packets will be available for pickup at Town Hall beginning January 2, 2019. Town Hall is open Monday

FEBRUARY

through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Candidates may begin returning their applications to be placed on the ballot and other candidate paperwork to Town Hall beginning on **Wednesday**, **January 16, 2019**. The deadline for filing applications to be placed on the ballot is 5:00 p.m. **Friday**, **February 15, 2019**.

A Fairview Town Council candidate must:

- Be a qualified voter of the town
- Be twenty-one (21) years of age
- Have resided in the town no less than twelve months immediately preceding Election Day
- Meet the requirements of the Texas Election Code
- Continually reside within the town during the term of office



# Fairview Youth Theatre

Fairview Youth Theatre is excited for the new year and all the classes, workshops and productions they have lined up. Classes start at the end of January and will fill up quickly so sign up now. All students benefit from the knowledge and guidance of experienced professionals who have performed and taught in some of the most well-known theatres and film stages around the United States.

First up is the **STARters** for children ages 2-4. The Explore Theatre class will guide children through music, dance and theatre divided into 20 minute sections to keep the most active student engaged. By using their face, voice, body and imagination children will begin to discover the magic of the stage. Classes are offered on Monday afternoons or on Thursday mornings.

In the **Rising Stars** program young performers will learn theatrical and life skills in a safe and supportive environment. Students ages 5-7 can participate in Mini-Musicals, a perfect introduction to theatre with a shortened script and 6-week rehearsal process. The line up for spring classes include Improv, Acting I, Advanced Stage Combat, Intro To Film And Video, Intro To Musical Theatre Dance, Intro To Sage Combat, Intro To Tech, Intro To Acting, Intro To Characterization, Jazz, Performance Tap and Tap I.

New students and families looking to get involved with FVYT but aren't quite sure where to start can join the NEW NTPA **UpSTARt Workshop**. This free 2-hour workshop is designed for the "new student" who wants to learn more about being a star on an FVYT stage! On the third Friday of each month at 5:00 p.m. this fast-paced, highenergy and fun-filled workshop will give your future actor the confidence to "take the stage" and the training so that they know what to expect at FVYT. There is even a Parent Session to help explain their role in preparing a child for an audition and the production.

On stage in January is *Mary Poppins Jr*. Based on one of the most popular Disney movies of all time and the Broadway musical that played for over 2,500 performances and received multiple Olivier and Tony Awards



nominations. Mary Poppins, Jr. will be open January 18-26.

Auditions taking place in January are *Thoroughly Modern Mille, Jr.*, January 6 and 11 for grades fifth through eigth. *Elephant and Piggie's We are in a Play*, will audition on January 7, 10 and 12 for students in kindergarten through eighth grade. 


## Denim and Diamonds The Party

### Remember These Simple Guidelines For Putting Your Trash Out

- 1. Place carts on the edge of the street/alley with handles facing the house and with the lids opening to the street/alley.
- 2. Keep carts two to three feet apart and away from fences, cars, gates, gas meters, etc...
- 3. All trash should be contained in securely tied plastic bags, All bags should fit into the cart with the lid closed.
- 4. Do not place hazardous household waste in your cart.
- 5. Place your carts out by 7 a.m. on pick up day; carts should not be left out after 6 a.m. the following day.
- 6. Do not place any items out side your carts; unless it's for bulk pick up.
- 7. Brush and bulk trash must not be more than 12 cubic yards which is equal to 4 truck loads.

## HEARD HAPPENINGS

It's never too cold to visit the Heard Natural Science Museum & Wildlife Sanctuary and they have plenty of exhibits and programs, both indoor and out, to keep you busy all year long and January is no exception.

Th Heard offers guided trails, workshops and service projects that are appropriate for all types of groups with an interest in exploring the outdoors, including Cub Scouts, Webelos, Brownies, Junior Girl Scouts, Campfire, Bluebirds, and YMCA Guides.

On January 12 the Heard is hosting two two-hour scout badge workshops for Webelos: Into the Woods and Earth Rocks. Cub Scouts will have their chance for badges on January 19 at two separate workshops as well: Fur, Feather & Ferns and Super Science.

The Heard is also hosting its Winter Hike Night on January 12. Visitors

No experience is necessary to participate in this class. All materials will vary because they are sourced from recycled materials. Ages 17+. Closed-toed shoes and long pants required. Participants should bring a packed lunch. This class will be led by Jacqui Bush of Stained Glass of McKinney.
