

Hi Gairview!

Summer is heating up now, and I'm hoping for dryer weather for the June 29 events at Fire Station 1. In addition to a big celebration of Fairview Fire Rescue's 50th anniversary, we will be unveiling a brand new Firefighter Honor Wall and dedicating Fire Station 1 in honor of former Fairview Fire Chief Dick Price. You are all invited to this celebration, which will include fun for the kids. It all starts at 9 a.m. Saturday, June 29.

If the ground is dry, parking will be available on the north side of Fire Station 1 (510 S. State Highway 5.) If it's muddy, flaggers will direct visitors to available parking.

When I get back from my trip to France, I'm excited to check out two new businesses that have opened up in Fairview Town Center: Larks Entertainment, where Bowlero used to be, and Neon Cactus, where Wild Salsa was.

Larks is introducing shuffleboard to Texas, and the Fairview location is the first of a planned chain of venues across the country, so we get to be the first to try it out! In addition to shuffleboard lanes, there's an arcade and an interactive trivia game that big groups can play together. Larks also serves food and drinks.

Like Wild Salsa, Neon Cactus serves Mexican food, but they've changed up the menu to include entrees inspired by Asian cuisine and other spicy new options. I hope you'll stop in for dinner. We need to support our local businesses.

Speaking of Fairview Town Center, I'll be helping to kick off the annual bike parade at the mall fountain at 9 a.m. July 4. This is a fun tradition for families, where kids decorate their bikes and wagons and go around the mall. Prizes will be awarded for the most patriotic outfits and bikes.

Please remember that fireworks are not allowed in Fairview. We want a fun holiday, so our police officers and fire marshal will be patrolling and making sure everyone is celebrating safely. If you're looking for a fireworks show, check out the show in Allen on Saturday, July 29, at Celebration Park. Tickets (free) will be required for entry this year. You can get more information at AllenUSA.org.

Please mark your calendars for the annual Peanut Butter Drive to benefit the North Texas Food Bank. Fairview always shows up big for this event as we compete against other area cities for largest donations. Collections will begin Sept. 1.

Fire Station 1 Receiving **Dedication**

Dick Price helped create and fulfill a vision for Fairview Fire Rescue.

Price served with the Fairview Fire Department for 18 years – including 13 years as chief – beginning in 1998, when the department was staffed entirely with volunteers using hand-me-down equipment from other area fire departments.

Price's involvement began when he saw the department's volunteer crew battle a residential fire. The next day, he met with the volunteers to review their equipment needs and his suggestions for improving procedures and training. Working with the Town's administration at the time, Price helped map out a plan for bringing Fairview's fire response to the level of a fully staffed, well-funded department.

Price's experience with firefighting tactics had begun more than two decades earlier, when he became a certified firefighter and EMT in Indiana. His background in the business world - managing disaster plan development for MCI-Verizon - helped Price bridge the communication gap between Town staff and the volunteer firefighters.

During his 18 years of service, his contributions helped build the department to today's full-service department with advanced life support capabilities



and an Insurance Services Organization (ISO) rating of 2 (compared to an original rating of 5). As the department approaches its 50th anniversary, the Town Council and administration wanted a way to honor Price for his service.

So, beginning at 9 a.m. Saturday, June 29, Fairview Fire Station 1, which sits at 510 S. State Highway 5, will bear a new identity: The name "Richard Price" will be added above "Fire Station 1."

Just to the south of the fire station, an Honor Wall will also be dedicated to past, current and future firefighters to recognize them for their contributions to Fairview Fire Rescue.

The Town Council and administration thanks all the community leaders who have served and helped strengthen Fairview Fire Rescue. Please join us as we celebrate the department's 50th anniversary and honor our firefighters and supporters. Refreshments, including food donated by Chick-fil-A in McKinney, snow cones and popcorn will be available, and children can have fun in the bounce house. Parking will be available north of the fire station.

Grilling Safety

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

SAFETY TIPS

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- >>> The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- >>> Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- >>>> Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- >>> Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- >>> There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- >>> Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- >>>> There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

PROPANE Grills

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. **If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department.** Do not move the grill.

If the flame **goes out**, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least **5 minutes** before re-lighting it.

FACTS

July is the peak month for grill fires.
Roughly half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.

Asphalt has been poured for Fairview Crossing between Spur 399 and State Highway 5, and crews are working connections to Medical Center Drive and State Highway 5. A left turn lane from SH 5 is being added, and the road will be ready to open soon.

Design is complete for the extension of Fairview Parkway north of Ridgeview Drive, and a construction contract could be presented to the Town Council for consideration in July.

Additional work in the Foxglen subdivision will begin this summer to mitigate groundwater issues. Bids for that project were presented to the Town Council in June.

Butterflies and Dancing at the Heard

Visitors to the Native Texas Butterfly House and Garden at Heard Natural Science Museum & Wildlife Sanctuary will have the opportunity to walk among free-flying native butterflies and other pollinators through Sept. 28. Guests will be able to view butterflies up close while learning about their life stages and more.

The butterfly house is regularly stocked with an assortment of native butterfly species, which varies throughout the exhibit. Guests may even get to see a

butterfly emerge from a chrysalis. Inside the butterfly house, nectar plants are also available to feed the adult butterflies. There are even a few host plants for caterpillars to feed on ("host plants").

The butterfly garden, too, is filled with nectar plants and host plants that naturally attract these lovely creatures. Guests may even find a few ideas to try in home gardens, which can in turn help pollinators on a broader scale. From time to time, other species of wildlife that feed



on insects or the nectar plants may also be found in the butterfly garden, including

hummingbirds. This area is also a great setting for nature photography.

The Native Texas Butterfly House and Garden is included in museum general admission and is free for Heard Museum members. The Native Texas

Make Safety Part of Summer Traditions

July 4 marks the height of summer fun. Safeguard your family's holiday celebrations by remembering these important tips:

1. Vacation Watch

The Fairview Police Department offers a special watch program for vacationers. Fill out a form on the police department web page, and officers will provide extra patrols for your home if you're traveling out of town.

As you fill out the form, you'll be asked to note:

- The dates and times you'll be away from home
- How you can be reached if there's an emergency while you're away
- Whether any animals will remain at the home
- Whether any lights will be left on in your home, and if so, where
- The make, model, color and license plate of vehicles that should be at your home. (Don't forget about cleaning services or pet sitters)
- If you have an alarm system, whether an emergency contact has an access code to reset it

2. Ban on Fireworks in Fairview

Thousands of injuries are reported annually from sparklers and other seemingly harmless novelties purchased from fireworks stands. Many of those injuries involve children.

Fireworks pose a significant safety hazard for you, your family and pets, nearby structures and our natural surroundings. The Fairview Fire Marshall issues citations for violations of the Town's fireworks prohibition.

If you want to enjoy fireworks this summer, take in one of the professional shows organized by our neighbors in McKinney, Allen or surrounding communities.

Bird of the Month

One of my all-time favorite birds to photograph is the Greater Roadrunner. While they inhabit much of the Fairview/ McKinney area, they are still quite an elusive bird and can be tricky to spot as they are masters of disguise

and blend in well with their surroundings. They are ruthless and very capable predators. Their diet consists of insects, spiders, scorpions, lizards, snakes (including rattlesnakes) small rodents and even other birds.

Fun facts about roadrunners: They are very fast runners and can reach speeds of up to 26 mph. They get fluid from the food they eat and do not need to drink water. They are mostly ground-dwelling birds and rarely fly. And they are monogamous, mating for life and raising their little ones together.




The ABCs of Weekly Trash and Recycling Collection


Remember these tips to ensure efficient trash and recycling pickup:

- a. <u>Arrange</u> carts carefully with handles facing your home, lids open toward the street, and 2 feet of space between carts and other objects.
- **b.** <u>**Be**</u> punctual by placing carts at the edge of the street no earlier than 5 p.m. the day before collection and no later than 7 a.m. on collection day. Roll carts back to your house by 6 a.m. the day after pickup.
- **c.** <u>**Close**</u> lids without clamping or locking. If your trash cart is full, purchase a pink tag for \$2.14 from the Town. Only bags with Town-issued tags will be collected outside carts (except during bulk pickup week).

Did You Know? Empty cardboard boxes don't have to go to the landfill. If they're clean and dry, they can be cut down and folded flat to fit inside your recycling cart.

Avoid Missed Trash Collections

Republic Services has added more drivers, which allows collection of trash and recycling to occur more efficiently. Because of the change, collection trucks may reach your street earlier than in the past.

Please ensure all trash and recycling carts are at the curb no later than 7 a.m. on scheduled collection days to avoid a missed collection.

Other things to keep in mind:

All trash going to the landfill should be contained inside securely tied plastic bags, and all bags should fit inside your

solid blue cart with the lid closed.

- Pink tags may be purchased from the Town for \$2.14 each and placed on excess bags that don't fit inside your trash cart. Other than during bulk collection weeks, bags sitting outside of carts without a Townissued tag won't be collected.
- Recyclables should be placed loose, without bagging, into recycling carts, which are either solid green or dark blue with a lighter blue lid.
- Clean and dry empty cardboard boxes may be cut down and

folded flat to fit inside recycling bins.

- Never clamp or lock lids on trash or recycling carts.
- Place carts with handles facing the house and lids opening toward the street or alley.
- Carts must be placed 2 to 3 feet apart and away from objects that may obstruct the pickup arm.
