The Town of Fairview will be hosting a Christmas event Dec. 7, 2013 from 2:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. at Fairview Town Hall, located at 372 Town Place in The Village at Fairview. The event will feature a community stage, children's activities, bounce houses, an ice skating rink, a fun run, a Pearl Harbor remembrance and more.

The community stage, located in front of the Town Hall fountain on the west side of the building will showcase performances by the Lovejoy Elementary School Choir, the Willow Springs Middle School Choir, Creekwood United Methodist Church Choir and the Heritage Ranch Line Dancers. Bring your chairs, set up and stay awhile.

The children's activities include face painting and bounce houses and there will be an ice skating rink made of synthetic ice, for all ages. The ice rink has an area to change into skates and attendants will be on hand to help novices get on and off of the ice. Whether you are an experienced skater or a novice, the rink will provide great winter fun for the family. The 2 mile fun walk/run is also for the entire family and will start and end at Fairview Town Hall beginning at 4:00 p.m. Free online registration for the fun run is available at www.fairviewhalf.com.

There will be booths featuring Fairview businesses as well as local churches and non-profits These booths will feature a variety of items including give away items, product information and hot chocolate. There will be bags available that contain coupons to local businesses.

At 5:00 p.m., there will be a pause in festivities for a short ceremony remembering the 64th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. The festivities will end with a tree lighting ceremony at approximately 5:30 p.m., after which people are encouraged to spend the evening enjoying shopping and dining in The Village at Fairview.

This is our community event designed to provide fun for the entire family. Come out and join your neighbors as we experience the Christmas Season together.

VOLUNTEER DAY SUCCESS

Fairview's first ever, all volunteer, clean-up day was a huge success. Families, local churches, the mayor and council members, along with some town staff teamed up to clean up some unsightly messes along SH5, Stacy Rd, FM1378 and to perform some maintenance in Beaver Run park.

Families with smaller children were encouraged to come work at Beaver Run Park and a large group of families did just that. With shovels in hands and great attitudes of community involvement, parents and children began shoveling mulch for our playground equipment and trees, spreading crushed granite for our walking trails and piling up brush to give Beaver Run a face lift for the winter.

You could tell by the smiles on everyone's faces that more than simply cleanup was taking place that cloudy Saturday morning on October 26th. A sense of community pride and ownership was also taking hold from grandparents, toddlers, church leaders, members and councilmen.

Over 3 ½ pickup loads of bagged trash was dragged out of the trees, fences and roadside ditches to fill up the town's large dumpster to overflowing and 21.5 tons of decomposed crushed granite, 20 cubic yards (2 dump truck loads) of playground mulch and 34 bags of tree mulch had been spread in the park.

Well done Fairview, you deserve the town's thanks for a great Saturday morning of hard work and precious, sacrificed time. This is one of the many wonderful reasons Fairview is such a great and unique place to live.

NIXLE

The Nixle notification system is now available to Fairview residents. The town doesn't charge for this service, but message and data rates may apply if you chose to receive alerts through your cell phone/smart devices. This system allows residents to receive emergency alerts, advisory notifications and community related notifications. ARBOR DAY CELEBRATION

The Town of Fairview celebrated Arbor Day on November 2nd, 2013. This year, we partnered with Puster Elementary School's 4th grade art program to promote Arbor Day and provide a learning opportunity for students. Jenny Slaver, Puster's amazing art teacher, developed art projects surrounding the theme of trees. Her students read "The Giving Tree" by Shel Silverstein, allowing for a discussion on the benefits of trees and how the students can give back to the community through the promotion of trees. A L A R M P E R M I T S

Town of Fairview Ordinance 2013-9-3B requires all alarm systems, whether monitored or not, in any home or business in Fairview to have a valid Alarm Permit and for those permits to be renewed annually during the month of January. For those who currently have an alarm permit, online renewal begins January 1st. All permits are required to be renewed by January 31st. Simply log in using your Login name and password. If you need your Login name and password contact Officer Gandy. Do not create a new account.

The residential renewal fee is \$25.00 and the commercial renewal fee is \$50.00. New residential permits are \$50.00 and new commercial permits are \$100.00.
