Protecting Your Computer: Three Simple Steps

1. Update your computer with the latest Microsoft patches and Security Updates and other software updates such as Java and Flash.

Why is this so important? Consider this example: In 2007, the Miami Dolphins website was hacked. Hackers implanted malleolus code on the website which quickly determined if a PC

visiting the website had a Microsoft vulnerability. If it did, the infected website downloaded malleolus code to the user's PC, which stole passwords and setup the user's PC for more infectious downloads in the future. (Microsoft released security patches to block this type of exploit months prior to this event, but millions of users had not run the Microsoft updates yet). So the point here is ALWAYS, ALWAYS keep your computer up-to-date with the latest security patches from your application vendors including; Microsoft, Adobe, FLASH, etc.

2. Always have a good quality Antivirus solution running on your PC.

If you let your PC lapse in Antivirus protection for just a few days you're risking too much. There are two main considerations in choosing Antivirus Software. 1. Quality of Protection: Antivirus software is not all the same, some catch viruses and adware better than others. 2. Performance Degradation: Some Antivirus software can slow down your PC considerably, especially if its and older computer. PC Magazine (PCMag.com) has a great review article on Antivirus Software for 2012. Bottom line, pick one of these 4 for best results; 1. Webroot Secure Anywhere Antivirus, Norton AntiVirus 2012, Bitdefender Antivirus Plus 2012, or Kaspersky Anti-Virus 2012. Everyone has their favorite, and ours is Bitdefender for great performance without

3. Don't login to your PC as Administrator of the PC.

Create another user account and set it up as a standard user. You will have much greater protection from being hacked because a standard user does not have all the permissions that the Administrator does and many of today's malicious code needs full permissions to do its evil.
